Alternative Transportation Fuels

4CORE assisted vehicle fleets, fuel providers and auto dealers in La Plata and Montezuma Counties under the Refuel Colorado Fleets program. Assistance was provided through assessing the viability of alternative fuel vehicles (AFVs) with Energy Coaching, organizing stakeholder meetings and conducting fleet audits. 4CORE continues to disseminate information on AFV models, fueling infrastructure, incentives and tax credits for AFVs and infrastructure needs. 4CORE customized Energy Coaching services for nine (9) fleet managers in 2015 based on their needs.

Six public meetings were held to showcase AFVs, answer questions, dialogue about infrastructure and provide information on the latest technologies. Two additional meetings were held with a small group of stakeholders to best determine how Southwest Colorado could overcome the “chicken and egg” dilemma associated with compressed natural gas (CNG) vehicles and fueling infrastructure.

Looking Ahead

The 4CORE board recently underwent a strategic planning process after several years of steady federal grant funding (4CORE brought approximately \$8 million dollars into the local economy by weatherizing low income homes and carrying other collaborative grant funded projects during this time).

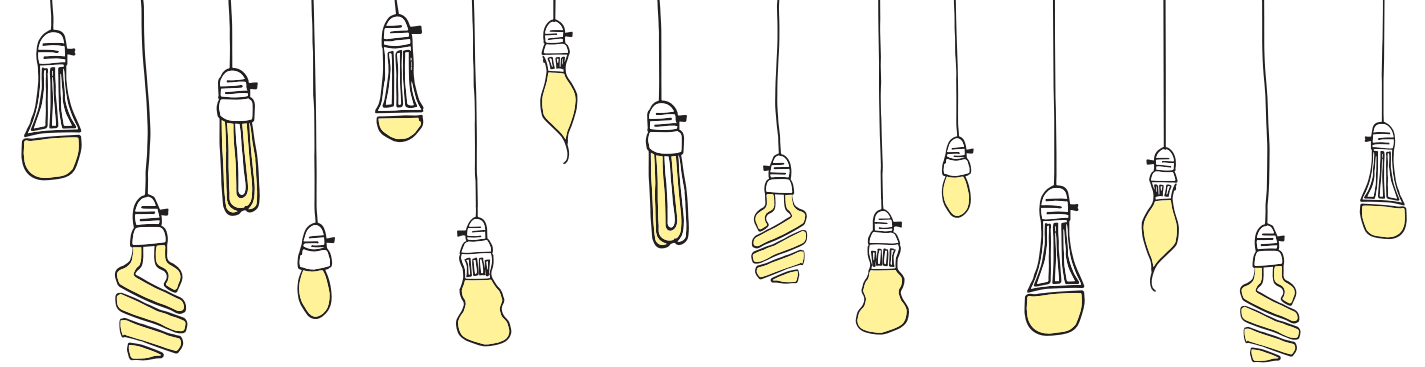

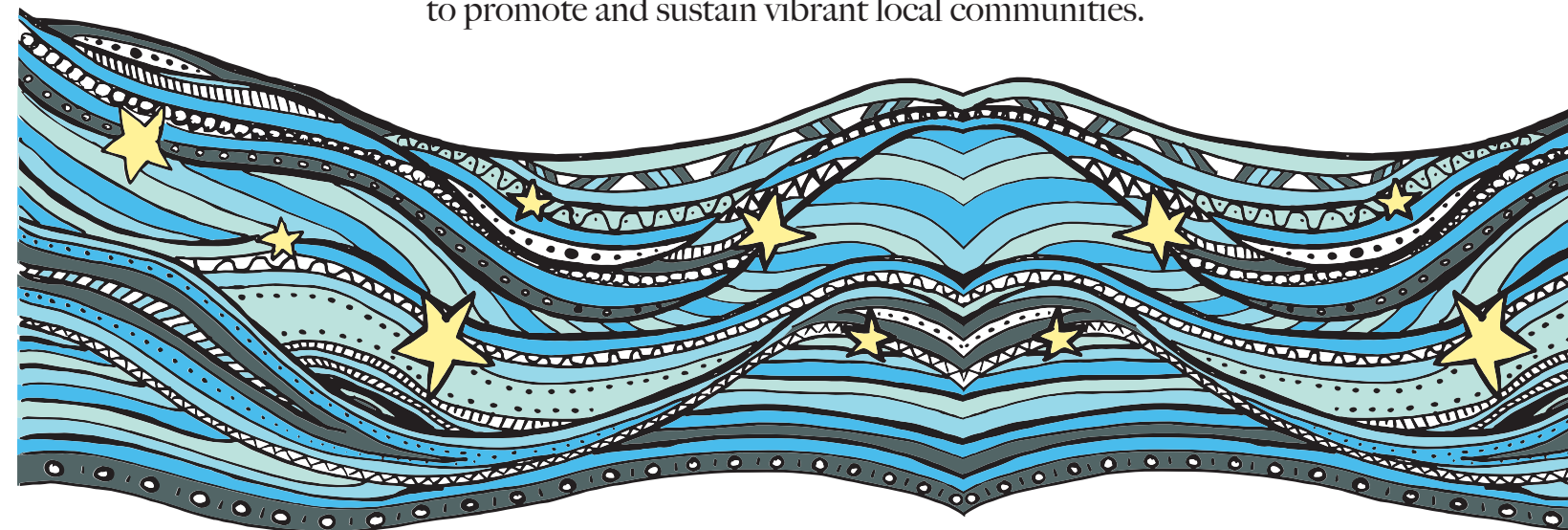

2015 Focus Areas In Review

Information Hub

- Responded to 103 information requests about resource efficiency through phone, walk-in, and e-mail inquiries, attendance at presentations, newsletters, web site visits and social media.

Innovative Solutions

- Initiated the Solarize Archuleta Campaign and signed up over 108 homes to receive solar consultation; completed 2 installations in three month on 2015.
- Facilitated 12 regional working group meetings to discuss alternative fuel vehicles for fleets.
- Met with six (6) fleet managers to discuss fleet analyses as part of the Refuel Colorado Fleets program.
- Met with five (5) potential electric vehicle charging stations.
- Secured funding for a solar program that will provide solar power to low-income families in 2016.

Energy Education

- Presented energy efficient and/or innovative energy information to 314 participants in trainings, open houses, classes and workshops.

Energy Efficiency

- 4CORE's HomeRx Program assessed 42 homes, creating potential for \$7,964 in annual utility savings and preventing 46 metric tons of carbon pollution.
- CommercialRx assessed five businesses, creating the potential for an \$5,959 reduction in utility bills each year and the prevention of 33 metric tons of carbon pollution.

Energy Efficiency for Home & Business

4CORE worked with the City of Durango, and Energy Smart Colorado, Amerigas, and a variety of other entities to make rebates and incentives for energy improvements available in Southwest Colorado. 4CORE conducted home and commercial energy assessments for a variety of clients, and developed a referral program to connect home and building owners to local energy professionals.

Solarize Archuleta

Solarize Archuleta was initiated by 4CORE and a group of committed citizens to break down financial, technical and inertial barriers that usually prevent people from going solar.

4CORE helped sign up over 108 participants in 2015. Two installations were completed after the program rollout in late September. The goal for the campaign is 30 installations by July 2016.

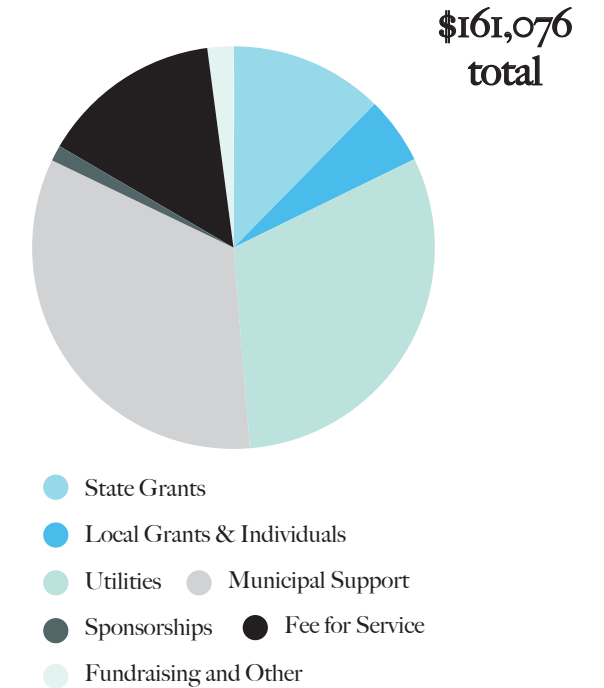

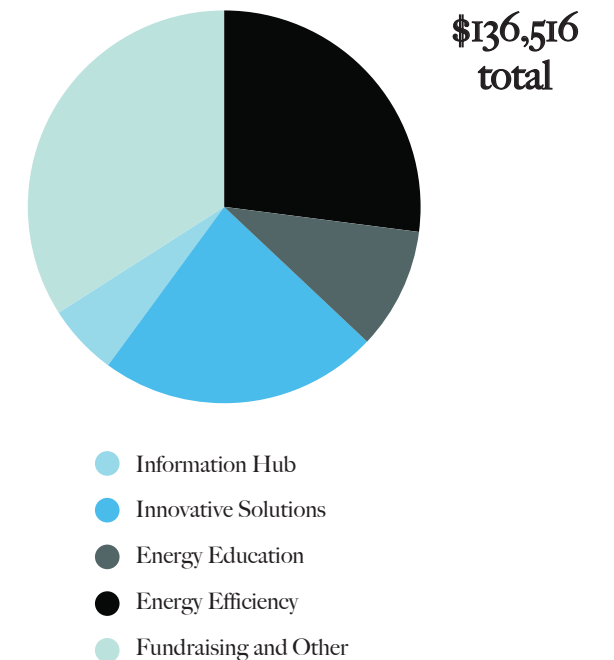
